As a responsible mother, she would definitely not dessert her son and she does not let Gump who has mental retardation go to special school. Although she is abandoned by her husband and she has reasons to leave her son, but she did not. What she says and what she does have demonstrated the quality of a great mother who shows her own American-style optimism that has been passed down from generation to generation. When Gump is still a kid, she has a best friend whose name is Jenny. However, as Jenny grows up, she becomes a rebellious youth who seeks for a so-called freedom. She drops out of school in order to pose nude and participates in the feminist movement and the sexual revolution as well as the campaign against racial discrimination. Unfortunately, Jenny is messed up with drugs. However, when she sees Forrest Gump keeping running on the television, she is touched and encouraged, and decides to get rid of these bad habits and to be a good woman. Then she makes it and finds a sense of happiness which is a form of optimism. At the wedding of Forrest Gump and Jenny, another person shows up. That is Captain. She teaches his son to face life positively and courageously instead of feeling different from other normal people. Her love and persistence enable Gump to feel the warmth of family. At the same time, it is necessary to mention the power of women reflected on Gump's mother. In the movie, the headmaster advises Gump to go to a special school while his mother insists on her son going to public school like other kids. Gump's mother fights against the headmaster and shows her strength in the male-dominant society. In addition, Ms. Gump's attitude towards death also reveals a kind of American-style optimism. It is seen that the demonstration of female's greatness and courage. When she tells Gump she's dying, she shows that she optimistically accepts the end of life. Her attitude enables Gump not to be afraid of anything, even the permanent departure. As a mother, Ms. Gump leaves valuable assets and optimistic spirit to her son. On the other hand, unlike Ms. Gump, Gump's girlfriend, Jenny, who desires to seek for the freedom of love, is rebellious and degenerates in life. She is the representative of tragedy. And what she has done reflects a phenomenon that women hope to get rid of the limitations imposed on them by traditional morality. For Jenny, she dares to, at that time, fight against the injustice and inequality, and her consciousness in pursuit of equal rights gains day by day, but she adopts unorthodox measures. By contrast, women living in the 18th or 19th century were limited by the male and the patriarchal society. For example, they must clean the house, prepare the dinner, and take care of kids while their husbands do nothing at home. Besides, women were also subordinated and oppressed by male and male-dominant perceptions.
